

**US Ski & Snowboard
INTERNATIONAL WORLD CUP SELECTION CRITERIA
2022/23 Ski Cross**

Eligibility for Consideration:

U.S. Ski & Snowboard will consider for selection only those U.S. Ski & Snowboard members in good standing who have a valid U.S. passport, a valid USA-coded FIS license, and who meet FIS minimum eligibility standards.

U.S. Ski & Snowboard provides an equal opportunity to amateur athletes, coaches, trainers, managers, administrators, and officials to participate in amateur athletic competition, without discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, age, sex, or gender identity, national origin, and with fair notice and opportunity for a hearing before declaring any such individual ineligible to participate.

Criteria Guidelines:

- U.S. Ski & Snowboard policy mandates that team selection criteria shall be principally objective (or performance-based)
- The Alpine Sport Director is responsible for applying the selection criteria set forth herein
- The team selected by U.S. Ski & Snowboard may consist of any number of athletes up to the FIS World Cup quota for the United States.
- The quota of start rights per nation is set annually by the FIS.

SKI CROSS (4 men / 4 women)

The following allocation system will be used to fill available quotas with athletes that meet the FIS criteria for entry (100 FIS Ski Cross points). If an athlete declines the nomination then the next ranked athlete may be invited within the specific criteria ranking list.

Events: November / December / January World Cups

Criteria #1 Top 2 men from the 2022 World Cup Ski Cross rankings

Criteria #2 The remaining 4 men and 1 woman (not already qualified from above criteria) from the 2023 FIS Base Points List. Must meet minimum World Cup FIS point requirements for entry.

Events: February / March World Cups

Criteria #1 Top 3 men from the current 2022-23 World Cup Ski Cross rankings

Criteria #2 Top 3 men / 1 woman (not already qualified from the above criteria) from the FIS Points List #7 (valid January 5th, 2023). Must meet minimum World Cup FIS point requirements for entry.

U.S. SKI & SNOWBOARD APPEAL AND GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES

Any member who believes that he/she has wrongfully been denied membership on any team whose members are selected through participation in “protected competition,” as that term is defined in the USOC Bylaws, shall be entitled to appeal such decision.
