



Club Compliance Policy

U.S. Ski & Snowboard is committed to working with member clubs to ensure they have the tools to operate at a professional level. Our commitment is to aid club partners in providing a safe and secure environment for athletes and all members. The document below outlines U.S. Ski and Snowboard's Club Compliance Policy.

The Club Compliance Policy requires adherence to our Club Minimum Standards and how non-compliance will be managed. The policy includes providing all requested documents at the time of registration and outlines our process for those member clubs who fail to meet the standards after registering.

Club Minimum Standards

U.S. Ski & Snowboard member clubs must achieve and maintain compliance with [Club Minimum Standards](#) to maintain good standing, eligibility to host U.S. Ski & Snowboard and FIS-sanctioned events, as well as continued participation in the Club Liability Insurance Program, where applicable.

Clubs who do not meet these minimum standards by December 31st each year will be placed on a public "Non-Compliant" list.

Clubs that fail to provide the following required documents with their application will not be processed:

- ✓ Proof of general liability policy;
- ✓ Proof of legal business entity in good standing;
- ✓ List of three (3) club leaders with individual emails for each; and
- ✓ List of Board members (or members of the Athlete Safety Committee, where applicable).

Non-Compliant Clubs from Previous Seasons

Clubs who have been non-compliant in a previous season will not be processed until all [Club Minimum Standards](#) have been met.

Clubs that fail to ensure all Board members and all coaches register with U.S. Ski and Snowboard and complete membership requirements by December 31st.

- Notice of non-compliance sent by Member Services providing two (2) weeks to remedy issue(s).
- Club placed on inactive status if issue is not remedied within two (2) weeks of notice from Member Services.
- All members removed from Club Roster by January 31st.
- Podium Certified clubs will lose their Podium Certification status until they are in full compliance.
- Insurance canceled for non-compliant CLIP clubs on January 31st.
- Inability to sanction events in the coming season unless all requirements are met prior to registration.
